## EXPECTATION FOR BEHAVIOR OF GUESTS AT GRADUATION

- Please arrive on time and be seated prior to the procession of graduates.
- Do not block the aisles.
- Do not allow young children to wander unattended.
- No beach balls, horns, or other noise makers.
- No applause or cheering until all the names are read.

This last rule is most important to us. We believe that every graduate is the same, regardless of academic rank or achievements, and each deserves the opportunity to have his or her name read and heard by all in attendance.

The long tradition at Arlington Catholic is that all applause and cheering is held until the point in the ceremony where the "Graduated Class of 2019" is presented, thus giving each student the same opportunity to be cheered as a class. This also allows each student's name to be heard when read and doesn't distract the student as they receive their diploma from the Pastor.
