



She looked to her right and then to her left and then jumped from her seat, ran up, and grabbed my leg giving me a long and strong bear hug. 

Alumni Spotlight: Jeremiah Hallisey, SAS '52

We recently had the opportunity to speak with Jeremiah "Jerry" Hallisey, a 1952 graduate of Saint Agnes School. Jerry is an attorney living in the San Francisco Bay area, is widowed, and is the father of two sons. After leaving Saint Agnes, Jerry attended Matignon High School. Following his graduation from Matignon High School, he matriculated to Boston College where he received his A.B. degree in 1960. He received his Master's degree in 1962 from Cornell University. In 1966 he received his J.D. degree from the University of California at Berkeley and was admitted to the California bar in 1966. Jerry's areas of expertise include Trial Practice, Probate, Trusts and Estates, Educational Law, Commercial, and Energy.
