

In honor of Veteran's Day, we recently spoke with United States Air Force Officer and Pilot, Luke Amato '14. Luke is currently stationed at Laughlin AFB, Texas where he is an instructor pilot in the T-6A Texan II, whose mission is to build combat-ready airmen, leaders and pilots.

Paul has served on many boards and committee over the years to help our communities to be better places to live. Many have been in the Autism world as his two boys, Neil and Tyler are part of this community.


