A Word from President Keough

Dear Saint Agnes School/Arlington Catholic High School Community,

They say that with age comes wisdom. I am not sure I buy that completely because even as a pretty old guy, I still make a lot of mistakes and clearly lack wisdom at times. But I will say this: I am coming to understand much more than I did as a young person, and much of that understanding has come from life's experiences.



As I greeted students at our middle school and high school a few weeks back, I could not help but notice some of the angst on the faces of the students. It is a new year with new routines, plenty of moments of awkwardness, and even some setbacks (not making specific teams, not having the teachers they'd hoped for, or the classic, not "having any friends" in their classes). Going through these challenges as a teen can be hard and seem like "the end of the world" in the moment. The American folk singer Joanie Mitchell, in her song, *I Think I Understand* helped me to see life and its challenges through a whole new lens and has helped me to gain new insights through the years.

In it, she writes of the traveler who while following life's path, encounters incredibly dark, frightening stretches of "wilderland" wherein the light is blocked out and the trail feels like stretches of "stepping stones and sinking sand." But, as she "comes to understand", it is within her power to confront the darkness that comes with being afraid, through thoughts of brighter times and friendships. She clearly understands that dark times are part of life's experience... and can be very scary. However, when we recognize that they will pass and brighter times will come, we rob the "darkness" of its power.

At Saint Agnes School/Arlington Catholic High School, we take the additional stepping of "robbing the darkness blind" by teaching our students about faith. Faith that hard times come but will always pass when we trust in God. Teaching our young people that God never abandons us and that having a relationship with him is the equivalent of

wrapping oneself in a protective cloak or shield that provides remarkable strength during the inevitable challenging times of life and especially adolescence. In truth, especially after watching senseless school tragedies like the one that played out in Georgia recently, I wish all students could be taught about faith, much as they were many years ago, when going to church and saying grace before dinner were commonplace in everyday American life. Perhaps there would not be so many young people viewing their world as perpetually dark, with no hope of brighter times. Our students are incredibly fortunate to come from families that understand this need for faith and I am grateful to be part of what takes place here on Medford Street.

I genuinely appreciate the support you show for us day in and day out and am praying for you and your families as we start the new year. Have a wonderful transition to fall!
