The program for Junior Volunteers at Winchester Hospital is a very well organized program. Some of the duties of a Junior Volunteer include: transporting patients to areas within the hospital, transporting specimens to the laboratory, delivering medications from the pharmacy to the nursing stations, delivering medical records, test results and reports, flowers, etc. Junior Volunteers also work in the coffee shop. The students would need to complete a brief orientation. The shifts generally work Monday through Friday from 3:00 – 6:00 P.M. or Saturday and Sunday from 9:00 A.M. until 12:00 P.M. or from 12:00 – 3:00 P.M. The volunteers are asked to work at least on shift per week. The volunteers are asked to work for at least 8 weeks due to the training. Therefore, volunteers are asked to give at least 24 hours of service. Students must fill out an application and call to arrange a preliminary interview.
